## Explaining the levels

The National Curriculum levels for the Year Two children last year were in the format of levels 1, 2, 3 etc. where 1 is the first National Curriculum level before children move onto level 2 and then 3 etc. The national expectation for children at the end of Key Stage One (so the end of their time in Years One and Two) was a level 2. For Reading, Writing and Maths the level 2 is then sublevelled where 2c is for the bottom of the level, 2b for securely within the level and 2a for working at the top of the level. The national expectation for the end of Year Two in 2015 for these subjects was a level 2b.

W represents children who are working towards level 1, but have not yet achieved the standards needed for level 1.
