## Money, money, money!

In school, the children have been spending time learning about money in both Maths and PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health, Citizenship and Economics). They have been focusing on recognising coins and understanding their value. The children have been learning that the size of the coin does not relate to it's value, ie, the smallest coins are not necessarily worth the least amount.

The Year Two classes have also taken part in Moneywise Workshops with Ian Bamford from NatWest Bank. They have been discussing saving, spending and borrowing and trying to understand how to make sensible financial decisions as they get older.

Using money, rather than cards, is becoming something that families, and therefore our children, are doing less and less. To help children with their learning in this area, please give children opportunities, where possible, to handle, count and pay with coins.
