#### Head Lice/Nits

Head lice are an ongoing pest in schools across the country and ours is no exception. Please be vigilant, checking your child's hair daily and treating when necessary. You will have to keep checking to make sure that all the eggs have gone even after treatment. Contact the doctors' surgery or the pharmacy for further information. #### Names in clothing

Please, please, please ensure that as many items as possible, including tights, PE kits, shoes, coats etc are named. It may sound over the top but when changing for PE, Forest Schools and sports clubs trying to identify which shoes and tights belong to each child can be challenging!



#### **Communication**

Parents are always welcome, and indeed encouraged, to come into school to talk to members of staff. If you have any ideas, questions, comments or queries then please do come and speak to us. Telephone, letter and email are also ways of contacting us in school.

We welcome feedback on the things that you feel work well but also welcome suggestions on how we can improve things, as a school. It is much better to share your thoughts with us so that we can work with you to do something about it and to make changes. You are all an important part of our continual drive to improve the learning experience that we offer to our children.

#### Inhalers and Epi pens

If your child has either an epi pen or a blue reliever inhaler for asthma at home then we also need one in school. The surgery say that they are happy to prescribe two of these for the purposes of having one at home and one at school. In classes, all inhalers are stored in areas that are easily accessible. Staff are trained in what

to look for in terms of signs and symptoms of asthma and anaphylaxis and there are emergency procedures in place. I would like to ask that, if

you haven't already or haven't recently, parents discuss with their children their signs and symptoms so

that children are more aware of when they need to access their inhaler or ask for help. With children starting in new classes, please make some time to ensure that you have spoken to your child's class teacher about your child in relation to this. Please don't hesitate to contact staff to give them updates about your child's medical condition, including when triggers (such as colds or weather) is particularly affecting them. If you don't get chance to do this in person then this is a great reason to use the class email - the more information that we share about medical conditions the better position we are all in to care for them.

Newsletters - These are emailed to you - school newsletter and a class newsletter on alternate weeks.

Diary Dates - At the beginning of the term Mrs Cook prepares a dates sheet to help you with forward planning. We try and organise things in advance but do watch out for inevitable changes and additions as staff plan trips and workshops etc for the children.

Handouts – Handouts may also come home each week. A list of these handouts will be on the front of the school newsletter, which lists handouts over the previous two weeks. Please check through to make sure that you have them all.

#### <u>Lollipop Lady</u>

Thank you to our families who cross the road in front of school with the assistance of our lollipop lady. The safety of our children and their families is very important to us and would ask that if you need to cross Ruffa Lane please do so with her assistance at the bottom of our main school path.

#### **Playground Buddies**



We are looking for Y1 and Y2 children to take on the important role of a Playground Buddy. Playground buddies are taught key leadership skills and different games to play at lunch and playtimes. They are trained and supported each Monday by Robbie Hawkes our sports coach and his team.

It is a responsible job which includes modelling good behavior, being kind to others and helping to organise games for other children.
