Friendship Week

Next week is our whole school themed week linked to friendship and national anti-bullying week. We will be spending time in school talking with the children about the term bullying. At Pickering Infant and Nursery School, we describe bullying as "unacceptable behaviour which occurs on repeated occasions, on purpose", which all of our children know is unacceptable.

Because of the age of our children, we spend a lot of time talking to children about and supporting them with developing friendships and negotiating with each other. As with every aspect of learning, children earn these social skills at different times and in different ways.

Part of the focus will also be on helping our children to understand the difference between falling out with our friends and classmates and bullying, explaining that falling out with our friends or someone saying unkind words to us is not acceptable and needs to be dealt with but also is not bullying. Parental support with this would be greatly appreciated in helping children to understand the difference.

All of our year one and two children will be helping to review and update our Anti-bullying Policy next week.

Attendance

Good attendance and punctuality are important to a child's success in all aspects of school life. It has an impact on progress and achievement

as well as friendships. Thank you to all of those parents who ensure that they arrive at school on time every day — it is always trickier on cold, wet mornings but almost all of our children arrive on time, prepared to learn, every day!

A quick checklist of reminders:

- Telephone school on the first day of your child's absence
- Ensure that your contact details are up to date in case we need to contact you in an emergency or for information
- Be firm with your child about their attendance
- Try to arrange appointments out of school time
- If problems persist then do not hesitate to contact us to discuss

<u>Lateness</u>

Arriving late to school may cause difficulties for your child

- Missing important information about the day in registration
- It may be embarrassing to walk into a lesson that has already started
- Missing even part of a lesson can be difficult to catch up on

It can affect behaviour and self-esteem

If your child is late or going to be late:

- © Contact us and let us know why
- Take your child to their classroom and then sign the late book afterwards
- Come and see us if you have any difficulties
