# Water Bottles

Please make sure that your child brings a clearly named water bottle containing water (not juice or flavoured water) into school.

Fruit squash and flavoured waters are acidic and can cause tooth erosion, particularly when drunk between meals. Water bottles in classes are for keeping children

hydrated and must therefore contain only plain water.

# Before and After School Club

As our Before and After School Club numbers grow, we are moving the location of these clubs to give more space. After the Easter holiday, from Tuesday 13th April, these clubs will be based in the bottom classroom of the East Wing side of school. When you stand on Ruffa Lane, this is the furthest classroom to the right and nearest the modular building. Drop off and collection for the clubs will be at the bottom door on this side of school. We offer Before and After School Club places on either a regular or ad-hoc basis, as and when you need the provision for any children who attend our school. Our school based staff Mrs Johnson and Mrs Nichols run our Before School Club and Mrs Davis and Mrs Kelly run our After School Club. ### Moki Bands

Squirrel Class have been trialling a new resource in school this week—Moki



Bands! These are wristbands worn by the children and staff during school hours that record both the number of steps and the minutes of at least moderate activity that children take part in. This will be useful in helping us to look at levels of activity for our children and staff throughout the week but is also an excellent opportunity for some inter class physical competition when we can't, at the moment, do this across classes in person for sports events due to covid safety measures. Classes will be using these next term, taking turns for a week so that there is time to quarantine between uses.

#### <u>Motional</u>


The last twelve months have seen significant disruption to all of our lives. This has had an impact on all of us, in many different ways. Staff have been prioritising, as ever, the relationships across their classes and school and supporting the development of resilience and well-being for all. In school, we are starting to use an assessment tool called Motional, which should support us further with this. It is a tool that staff in class use to identify where individual children may have specific well-being needs and to offer activities to support. This will be an extra resource for us to use to enhance

the work that we already do with children in this regard and in no way is intended to be used as or replace help

from appropriate professionals wherever it is needed. If you have any concerns about your child's mental health, please contact your health care professionals or speak to your child's class teacher about the best next steps to access further support.

# **Covid Restrictions**

We are all looking forward to lock down restrictions potentially being eased gradually over the coming weeks and months to allow more social contact and a return to a little more normality.

Our current covid measures will remain in place until further guidance is received in schools from the Department for Education. We therefore ask that everyone continues to follow all of the following guidance that we have shared, including;

Keep the number of people entering our school site to a minimum

Please wear a face mask if you are able to when on school site

When in the playgrounds, please keep your children with you at all times and do not allow them to mix with other families or play with any of our equipment

Do not mix with other families on school site

We know that there are a number of opportunities in schools across the country that children have not had the opportunity to experience. These include school visits, whole school events such as concerts, plays and sports days. We know how important these events are and that these are often events that stand out for our children when they look back on their time in school. Many of us still remember those key visits and visitors to school from our own childhoods. We are in the process of planning dates for our summer term and will look to include visits and events for our whole school community if and when we are permitted to do so. You will see from our attached Diary Dates Sheet that our Sports Day, at the moment, is planned to be a joint event for children only across school. This will, of course, be subject to the covid restrictions and may need to take a different format to usual. We will keep you up to date of any changes to this, and other events, as and when we are able to. The safety of our whole school community and playing our part to reduce the chance of future lock downs and school closures remain our priority.
