Covid safety measures

Following the announcement on Monday for changes coming into effect on Monday 19th July I wanted to let you know that we will not be making any changes for the last week of term. I appreciate that staggered start and finish times can be logistically difficult but feel that making changes for the last five days of the school year would disruption unnecessary cause families arrangements that have already made. Staggered lunchtimes and playtimes will also remain in place. There are some opportunities for year groups to work at the same events, such as our sports sessions today, but still remaining in their class bubbles.

Until 16th August, everyone is still legally required to self-isolate if they have covid symptoms and if they are a close contact of a positive case. lt therefore remains essential that parents and children continue to socially distance as much as possible. In the last few weeks in particular, we have seen an increasing amount of children not staying with parents in playgrounds at the start and end of the day and families mixing in both class bubbles and in the playground. rates rise, we must all continue to do everything that we can to reduce the risk of high numbers of our school community being asked to self-isolate if there is a positive case. That would not be the end of school year or start of the holidays that any of us want. We understand the frustration of being asked to wear face masks outside and being asked to social distance on school grounds when this is not the case elsewhere but asking are this minimise everyone to do to

potential impact on vulnerable members of our community and on all of our summer holiday plans as infection rates continue to rise!
