Friendship Week

Next week is our whole school themed week linked to friendship and national anti-bullying week. We will be spending time in school talking with the children about the term bullying. At Pickering Infant and Nursery School, we describe bullying as "unacceptable behaviour which occurs on repeated occasions, on purpose", which all of our children know is unacceptable.

Because of the age of our children, we spend a lot of time talking to children about and supporting them with developing friendships and negotiating with each other.

As with every aspect of learning, children learn these social skills at different times and in different ways. Part of the focus will also be on helping our children to understand the difference between falling out with our friends and classmates and bullying, explaining that falling out with our friends or someone saying unkind words to us is not acceptable and needs to be dealt with but also is not bullying. Parental support with this would be greatly appreciated in helping children to understand the difference.

As part of the national anti-bullying campaign, we are asking everyone in school to wear odd socks to school on Monday 15th November as an opportunity to encourage people to express themselves and celebrate their individuality and what makes us all unique!

If children suffer a significant bump or injury at school, you will receive notification of this. For bumps to the head, at any point on the back of the head or forehead you will be given a red letter. This red letter has recently been updated to include advice from the NHS Head Injury Advice Sheet. A copy of this advice has been attached for your reference.

In the past some parents have been keen to attend the Workshops so that they can develop their understanding of Islam too and hear what information has been shared with the children so that they can answer any questions that their children might have. Parental Involvement

Following the sharing of our updated behaviour policy earlier this term, I would like to welcome parents into school to share any thoughts and ideas that you may have relating to this. This will be in the staffroom at 9am on Thursday 2nd December with Mrs Gillam. Please come to the school office if you are able to help. The kettle will be on and there will be biscuits to help our conversations!

We are also looking for a parent representative to join a working group who will be focusing on playground development for playtimes with support from a company called OPAL. There are staff and governor representatives also in the working group. There will be a series of meetings during the school day over the next eighteen months. The first dates for these meetings are Monday 29th Nov 1-3.45pm, Friday 3rd Dec 1-3.30pm and Tuesday 4th Jan 9am-12pm. Other meeting dates will be discussed during these meetings with four further meetings for next calendar year. Please contact the school office if you would like to be a part of this—no experience necessary!

End of Day Procedures

Thank you to everyone for all that you've done to make arrangements to accommodate the new starting and finishing times for schools across Pickering. Adjustments have been made where needed which we hope are helping families. Please remember that staff will only let children go with adults who they have been told that your child can go home with, including the regular adults who pick up. Please let us know as soon as you can if these arrangements are going to change. Prior to 8.30am on that school day, you can notify staff through class emails of any changes to collection. If it is after 8.30am, please let us know through the office so that we can make sure that staff will have got the message.

If we haven't been notified that your child can go home with someone who they don't usually go home with, even if we know them, we won't let your child go. It is not our intention to ever upset families or children with this arrangement and appreciate that this is sometimes the result of messages not being passed on as seamlessly in school as we intend. This arrangement though is for the safety of the children and we ask that everyone involved stays calm with the safety side of the arrangement in mind. We will aim to contact primary carers as quickly as possible to resolve the situation.

Your support for your child's education is crucial to their progress. Please let us know if there is any adjustments we need to make to help you support your child, for example: letters in large font; letters in different languages; wheelchair access; explaining things over the phone.
