#### **Computer Games**

As Christmas draws near and children share their Christmas

lists (of various lengths!) we are still hearing that a number of children are requesting computer games that are not age appropriate. We wanted to share with parents that games such as Grand Theft Auto and Call of Duty have been rated as suitable for adults aged 18 or over. This is because they have violent and sexual content that is unsuitable for children below the age of

18. Children below this age are still learning to distinguish between reality and fantasy. They learn how to socially interact and learn what is acceptable behaviour from their environment and this includes video games. As disappointing as it is for children to

hear, it is our role as adults to keep our

children safe and protected from age inappropriate content such as that contained in these games. #### **Arriving on time**

Thank you to those parents who ensure that children arrive at school on time and prepared for the day. We ask all parents to make every effort to get children to school on time as arriving in class late can mean that children miss important information about the day and feel uncomfortable or unsettled arriving in class when their classmates are already in the middle of their tasks. We appreciate that sometimes, despite our best efforts, that are occasions where you may arrive slightly late. If you do, please bring your child to the office to sign them in. They will be marked in the register as late. This is to ensure that our legally required registration documents are accurate and that we have an accurate record of which children are in school and this allows us to ensure that a dinner is ordered for every child.


