Water Bottles

Please make sure that your child brings a clearly named water bottle containing water (not juice or flavoured water) into school. Fruit squash and flavoured waters are acidic and can cause tooth erosion, particularly when drunk between meals. Water bottles in classes are for keeping children hydrated and must therefore contain only plain water.

Before and After School Club

Our Before and After School Clubs are located in the bottom classroom on the east side of school. If you stand on

Ruffa Lane, this is the furthest classroom to the right and nearest the modular building. We offer Before and After School Club places on either a



regular or ad-hoc basis, as and when you need the provision for any children who attend our school. Our school based staff Mrs Johnson and Mrs Nichols run our Before School Club and Miss Green, Mrs Davis and Mrs Kelly run our After School Club. Our After School Club runs from the end of the school day until 5pm (available until 6pm upon request) and includes a light tea and refreshment after a busy school day. The cost of the After School Club is £3.00 between 3.25pm and 4pm; £7.00 between 3.25pm and 5pm, including a light snack and drink; £3.00 between 5 and 6pm. Pickering Foodbank

A new community foodbank for Ryedale is opening its doors for families as an independent charity to provide emergency food and support. There are a team of volunteers in place to support this work out of Hungate Centre. The foodbank is open every Thursday 4-6pm at Hungate Centre in Pickering. We are in the process of becoming a referring agency. If you

are in need of support with food, please do not hesitate to contact school to access vouchers for the service. Equally, volunteers at Hungate Centre can also put families in touch with people who can help with challenges around housing or energy bills. Other referring agencies who can provide vouchers for food include Pickering Surgery and Citizens Advice. If you require access to food but have missed the Thursday opening, please also get in touch as we may be able to provide support out of the opening times. We are all only too aware that increases in the cost of most things is going to make household finances tighter than ever. As a community school, we are here to help. Student Teachers

As a school committed to professional development of staff within the education sector, we work closely with York St John University and Scarborough Teaching Alliance to offer placements and support to trainee teachers. We have recently said goodbye to Miss Scott who has been working in Rabbit Class this term, welcome Miss Turner back to school for her final placement in Squirrel Class and welcome Miss Clarke to school in Nursery. Whilst this is part of our commitment to supporting colleagues with high quality professional development, it also brings the added bonus for our school, staff and children of extra support in these classrooms, and lots of new ideas!

Play Equipment

Thank you for the responses so far to our plea for play equipment for our children. We are trying to reuse and repurpose as much as we can. Mrs Kelly and Mrs Carter have sent out requests for some play equipment, including lots of what we call 'loose parts' including guttering, tyres and crates. Please continue to get in touch if you have access to equipment that looks like it could be used purposefully for play. PLAY DISCLAIMER!

Our OPAL work comes with an explanation and plea to parents - play can be messy! Whilst we will spend time in play assemblies talking about safety and our rules for keeping safe, getting muddy and dirty is an inevitable part of play. Other than wellies when the weather is wetter than we hope that it's going to be in the coming months, children will not wear any protective clothing and so we ask that things like coats that children wear for school, as when children start in Nursery and Reception, are ones that are going to be relatively easy to regularly clean. Uniform may also need cleaning on a more regular basis. We appreciate that this may be a little inconvenient but truly believe that the benefits to the children will be huge compared to extra washing. We hope that you will agree. Where families find extra washing a challenge, please let us know as we regularly get donations of uniform that we can share with families to reduce how often you're needing to wash.

Your support for your child's education is crucial to their progress. Please let us know if there is any adjustments we need to make to help you support your child, for example: letters in large font; letters in different languages; wheelchair access; explaining things over the phone.
