Computer Games

As Christmas draws near and children share their Christmas lists (of various lengths!) we are still hearing that a number of children are requesting computer games that are not age appropriate. We wanted to share with

parents that games such as Grand Theft Auto and Call of Duty have been rated as suitable for adults aged 18 or over. This is because they have violent and sexual content that is unsuitable for children below the age of 18. Children below this age are learning to distinguish between reality and fantasy. They learn how to socially interact and learn what is acceptable behaviour from their environment and this includes video games. As disappointing as it is for children to hear, it is our role as adults to keep our children safe and protected from age inappropriate content such as that contained in these The games. thinkuknow website has some hints and tips about this area at https://www.thinkuknow.co.uk/parents/articles/gaming-whats-appropriate-for-your-child/ This includes advice on gaming as a family so that adults can support children through their gaming play.
