
Pickering Community Infant & Nursery School School Newsletter No 11 10th March 2023

If children are prescribed medication for a short period of time, for example, antibiotics, these can be administered by our admin team as long as they are required **four**

times per day. Three times a day can be managed at home by administering them in a morning, at home time and before bed, unless your child is with us for a longer day and they attend our After School Club. Parents/carers must complete an Administration of Medication form at the office before any medication can be administered.
