## <u>DfE Information Regarding the</u> <u>Measles Vaccination Uptake</u>

Measles cases are rising in England. Please find below information from the DfE regarding Measles.

Measles can be very serious and spreads easily. Children and adults who contract measles can end up in hospital or suffer long term health consequences. In rare cases, it can be fatal.

Measles is completely preventable with the measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine. The first dose is offered to children at 1 year of age and the second dose at 3 years and 4 months. Measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated and can be very disruptive in educational settings.

We are grateful for the support of early years settings, encouraging families to take up the vaccine.

Schools are also encouraged to remind parents to check that their children's vaccines are up to date. You can catch up on your MMR vaccine through your GP whatever your age.

#### Menu—Autumn 2023

With the attachments to the newsletter this week you will see a new styled menu from NYES Catering Services which will be serve in school from September. Mrs Boyes and Mrs Ring provide school meals that meet all the Government guidelines in nutritional standards. A freshly prepared two course meal will be offered every day. Please notify the school office if your child is vegetarian or has special dietary requirements (ie religious, allergies etc)

If circumstances change and you wish your child to bring a packed lunch from home, one week's notice must be given. We request that all packed lunches are provided in accordance with our packed lunch policy which is available on the school website or from the school office. Due to large numbers we can only cater for children having school lunches every day or packed lunches every day, not a combination of the two. Your understanding in this matter is greatly appreciated.

A variety of fresh bread will be served daily

Vegetables may vary from time to time depending on availability and season.

Fresh fruit or yoghurt will be served as a dessert option for two out of the five days to reduce sugar in the menu to meet with NHS guidance.

## Governor's Report - July 2023

This final term of the year always seems to fly by in a flash. Such a term for hard work and celebration. It's been a fantastic term at the school and I'd like to thank Mrs De Barr and Mrs Smith and all of our staff for their commitment to our children.

Since COVID, the level of attendance has not been as good as in previous years and has been a focus of our attention for some time. At the last Governors meeting before the end of the summer term we were pleased to hear that the attendance for this academic is 94%. Last year for the same time, it was 91%. We do hope that this can be maintained in the forthcoming academic year.

All the governors have done Safeguarding training and the Safeguarding Audit was submitted in February 2023 with positive comments.

We have gained grants with the support of Friends of School from the town council to help with improvements to our outdoor areas, sensory garden and forest school and look forward to seeing the outcome when all the work is completed. We also have joint working with Pickering Environmental Group with a three year plan for the wild flower area.

We received capital funding and we are looking to spend some of this on doors which need replacing and mending along with the windows in Squirrels, Rabbits and After School Club in mid-August which should save us some energy during the winter months.

The school is encouraging the children to be aware of the whole community in Pickering and have had a dance day with a local dance school, visited Pickering Fire Station, Pickering library and Outgang Lane allotments over the summer term. We also have links with the local PSCO who has been supporting us with parking and traffic issues at collection and drop off times as well as coming into school for a session with each class.

As I come to the end of my second year as Chair of Governors, I continue to be spellbound by all that is achieved in our Infant and Nursery school. Thanks to everyone for your contribution to that.
