Training Days

Everyone seems to have returned after a fun Easter break. Despite the weather, everyone seems to have enjoyed some relaxation as well as important family time.

We returned to school this term on Tuesday 9th April due to a staff training day. I wanted to take this opportunity to share more information about these, using the latest educational research it reinforces how valuable these are for the staff team, and ultimately our children.

There are five staff training days each school year. This is dedicated time that is used for updating staff qualifications, working together on school development priorities and updating staff knowledge in key areas including the curriculum, safeguarding and Special Educational Needs. Many of these hours are worked on the training days and some are used during several shorter evening sessions throughout the year. These training days are attended (pro-rata) for teachers, teaching assistants and office staff.

This year, the focus of our staff training days has been on;

- first aid training and qualifications
- Focusing on the role of adults and high quality interactions in children's play
- Safeguarding
- Group reading



Appointments

We would like to ask that, wherever possible, any appointments for children are made for after school or during holidays rather than during the school day particularly for dentist, doctor and optician appointments. We understand that this is sometimes not possible. In these cases, please let the office know so that they can ensure that lunch orders are correct and know when to expect the adult to collect your child. Please also let them have a copy of your child's appointment letter so that this can be recorded as authorised.

Before and After School Club

Our Before and After School Clubs are located in the bottom classroom on the east side of school. If you stand on is the furthest Ruffa Lane, this classroom to the right and nearest the modular building. We offer Before and After School Club places on either a regular or ad-hoc basis, as and when you need the provision for any children who attend our school. Our school based staff Mrs Johnson and Mrs Nichols run our Before School Club and Mrs Connors and Ms Crowder run our After School Club. Our After School Club runs from the end of the school day until 5pm and includes a light tea and refreshment after a busy school day.
