Physical Education (PE)

In a continuation of our information sharing last term about our curriculum, starting with the subject area of PSED (Personal, Social and Emotional Development), this week, we are looking at the area of PE.



Children in Key Stage One (Years One and Two) have two hours of PE per week. One of these is delivered by our Hawkes Health team. They mainly focus each half term on the sports and agility elements of the

National Curriculum. The second hour of PE is delivered by class teachers with a focus on gymnastics, dance and athletics. Our Reception classes take part in an hours PE session each half term. One half term it will be a sports focus delivered by the Hawkes Health team and the next half term it will be



delivered by class teachers with a focus on gymnastics and movement to music. Nursery have two movement sessions in the hall each week on different days. These focus on a carousel of activities that develop different ways of moving, stability, balance and object control.

A Royal celebration Lunch Wednesday 19th June


In celebration of the King's Official Birthday (Trooping the Colour) there will be a menu change on Wednesday 19th June.
