Families will be aware that this week saw our routine Ofsted Inspection. This took place on Tuesday 9th and Wednesday 10th July. It was a very busy two days during which time staff, and families children took opportunity to show inspectors what life is like at our wonderful school. Whilst we all appreciate the need to hold schools accountable for the education and pastoral support that they offer our children, it can be a very busy and stressful time, especially at this time in the school year. We greatly appreciate parental feedback to the inspectors but all of your kind words of support and encouragement during this time too. Again, this reflected the caring and wonderful school community that we are all lucky enough to be a part of. We now await the report before we can share any details of the findings of the inspectors. Unfortunately, staff will not be able to share any feedback until then. Given the very late date in the school year that the inspection took place, we do not expect to have the report before the end of term. We will make sure that, once it is released, we current Year Two will share with parents as well.
