
Signs of Spring!

The days are gradually getting longer and it is lovely to see bulbs and spring flowers springing up around us as spring approaches. Under our very large beech tree at the front of school there are lots of crocus bulbs springing into life. We

have spoken to the children this week about being respectful to nature and staying off the grass under the tree where these bulbs are growing. We kindly ask that parents remind children of this message on your way onto and off the school site.

You may have also noticed the installation of three new wooden planters at the front of school. These are SuDS planters, which are Sustainable Drainage Systems which are designer to manage rainwater run off from roofs. These have been donated and installed by Yorkshire Water as part of their commitment to sustainable drainage systems by reducing the amount of water entering the sewer network. We are pleased to have been included by them in their project!

Tuesday 11th February will be the national Safer Internet Day. With increasing access to devices that connect to the internet, it is vital that we all know how to keep ourselves and our children safe online. We will be sending out links and information relating to online safety next week via ParentMail. Keeping safe online is a theme that runs through both our Computing Curriculum and PSHCE/PSED Curriculum and is something that we talk to children about regularly.

We have a filtering system, Smoothwall, in place in school to filter the content of internet searches and information accessible to both children and staff. We also have monitoring systems in place to provide appropriate supervision to children when using digital equipment with internet access.

Please remember that most social media sites, such as Facebook, require users to be aged **thirteen** before they can have an account. It is a violation of their terms to provide false details to set up an account. This is to protect children from potential harm.

Whilst we know that parking on the streets around school can be difficult, we ask that families of children at school park respectfully and carefully.

Please remember that we have the parking permit system in place to help with this. For a charge of £5, an annual permit can be purchased for Eastgate car park for parking until 9.15am and between 3.15pm and 3.40pm during term time. Please contact the school office if you would

like to purchase a permit for this year. Alternatively, this can be accessed on our website under 'Parents' and 'Travelling to school'.

The staff car park in front of school is for staff only and must not be used by parents to drop off or collect their children from school. There is strictly no stopping or parking in the bus lane and parking tickets for offenders can be issued by parking wardens. It is essential these are kept clear at the start and end of the school day. Our local PCSO continues to regularly patrol the area.
