Keeping Safe

Safeguarding our children is one of our most important jobs as education staff and as a school. Keeping safe is also an important part of our curriculum for the children. You may have seen on Facebook or heard from your children that last week we had a visit from Pantosaurus!



Mrs Smith also sent information out last week about the lockdown procedures that we had a live opportunity to practice due to a dog on the loose! We linked this to our fire practice and systems in school for keeping safe. In some of our classes this sparked a lot of questions and conversations about what the children would do if there was a fire at home. In these circumstances, staff have stressed the need for children above all else, including teddy bears, to get themselves out of the building. However, all family and home circumstances are different and so we wanted to share that this may be an ideal opportunity to discuss your family plans in the event of a fire. Order by Friday 12th December to avoid disappointment as we will be unable to accommodate late orders.






Photographs and videos by parents are not permitted as it disrupts the performances and potentially breaches the rights of families by having unconsented images of their child shared.

Redeem your vouchers for free holiday activities and food this Christmas

On Monday 24th November vouchers were issued to all families whose children

are eligible for free places on FEAST activities this Christmas. You should have received this via email or text, from a platform called Holiday Activities. Follow the link in this to redeem your voucher and book your child's place on some of the fantastic activities on offer.

Don't worry if there's a waiting list - it doesn't always mean that an activity is full. To ensure that a wide range of families get to take part in FEAST, providers wait a number of days after vouchers are issued before accepting any bookings. Please request a place and you should receive notification from Holiday Activities if your place is confirmed. If you believe your child is eligible and you have not yet received your voucher, or you have lost it, please contact the school office.

Arriving on time



Thank you to those parents who ensure that children arrive at school on time and prepared for the day. We ask all parents to make every effort to get

children to school on time as arriving in class late can mean that children miss For a wide range of reasons, important information about the day and feel uncomfortable or unsettled arriving in class when their classmates have already started their day. We appreciate that sometimes, despite our best efforts, there are occasions where you may arrive slightly late. If you do, please bring your child to the office to sign them to use if your child has needed changing in. They will be marked in the register as late. This is to ensure that our legally required registration documents accurate and that we have an accurate record of which children are in school. This also allows us to ensure that a dinner is ordered for every child.

Registering for School

Do you have a toddler or know of anyone that does? Are they registered with us for a Nursery or School place? If it is your/their intention for your/their child to attend our school, please make sure that they are registered as this helps us with future plans. This is particularly important if your child was born between:

01/09/22—31/08/23 for Nursery place September 2026

01/09/21—31/08/22 for School place September 2026

Current Nursery parents please don't forget complete your line on

application for your child's place in Reception for September 2026. Current Year Two parents will also need to complete the online application for their child's place at the Junior school for September 2026. Closing date 15th January 2026.
